Parish Assembly

n Thursday 14 May we held our second Parish Assembly in the Library. This meeting is for local residents rather than a Council meeting and is an opportunity for local residents and organisations to join with us in a review of the past year in Buckhurst Hill, put forward suggestions for future projects and ask questions.

Prior to the Assembly there had been a Dementia Awareness Session held at Waitrose, led by former Parish Clerk and Dementia Champion, Nigel Moore.

The meeting was attended by representatives of the Buckhurst Hill Community Association, U3A (University of the Third Age), Alzheimer's Society, Essex Association of Local Councils, Everything Epping Forest, Buckhurst Hill Residents Society, Epping Forest District Council, St Johns CofE School, Age Concern Buckhurst Hill, Senior Men's Fellowship, Buckhurst Hill Women's Institute, Waitrose, Essex County Council, Woodford District National Trust as well as Councillors and Officers of the Parish Council. There were verbal updates from Age Concern Buckhurst Hill, BH Community Association, BH Residents' Society, U3A, District Councillor Gavin Chambers and County Councillor Valerie Metcalfe. The Chairman of the Council, Cllr Aniket Patel, highlighted elements from his report as did the Chairman of the Finance & Establishment Committee, Cllr Sylvia Watson; Chairman of the Recreation & Community Committee, Cllr Hale Wheeler; Chairman of the Planning & Environment Committee, Cllr Lucy Bacon and Chairman of the Personnel Committee, Cllr Joanne Share-Bernia. The reports are published elsewhere in the Magazine as is the Council's End of Year Accounts. Minutes of the meeting are available on the Parish Council's website.

The final item of the evening was the presentation of a cheque to the Alzheimer's Society for £1001. This represents funds collected over the year at Parish Council events for the Chairman's Charity, notably 'Christmas on Queens Road' which was run jointly with the BH Residents' Society. The cheque was collected by Megan Bailey, Alzheimer's Community Fundraiser

Chairman's Report

fter the successes of my first year as Chairman, where as a Parish Council, we oversaw the move of our offices to the Public Library; re-homed part of the Little Buddies Children's Centre: established our Community Cinema and held the inaugural Older Peoples Forum, to mention just a few, my second year as Chairman has been a frustrating one. Unfortunately, last summer the Parish Clerk left to take up a post nearer to his home in Kent, leaving us without a replacement for nearly six months. Consequently, we have not been able to achieve as much as we set out to do twelve months ago. We have however made some progress and now that we have our new Clerk, Kevin O'Brien, on board I'm confident that current and future projects will come through to fruition before very long. I would also like to thank our Deputy Clerk, Val Evans for assuming Clerk to the Council duties during that period of time, ensuring that the Council continued to deliver its statutory function.

As I have touched on above, the Parish Council relocated to the Public Library. This move has been very successful, with the Council saving money on office costs and enabling the library to remain open for an extra two days a week. The extra hours have been very well received by Mums coming in to

read to their young children, job seekers using the internet and schoolchildren and college students coming in to do homework and revise for exams.

The savings the Council made from the library move helped us to freeze the precept for each of the last three years, even though new Government measures have reduced the amount of money available to us in real terms this year. Despite the freeze we've continued to invest in our community halls and will do so again in 2015/16. Following extensive consultations last year; we've earmarked funds to redevelop our disused playground at Hornbeam Road into an Outdoor Gym. Whilst this was one of the projects that has been delayed following the former Clerk's departure and Kevin's arrival, we are now pushing forward and confident that work will commence in the not too distant future.

The Council has also made good use of its new home in the library. I have been keen particularly keen to help develop the library as a community hub and we now regularly host meetings such as Executive Committee meetings of the Chamber of Commerce, a number of Town Centre Partnership meetings and Buckhurst Hill Leisure Gardens Association. The library played a central part of the hugely successful Christmas Fair we held with the Residents' Society in December. Up to 800 local residents joined us for the celebrations in Queens Road and as a consequence we raised over £1000 on the day for the Alzheimer's Society, my Chairman's Charity for 2014/15.

The Parish Council has continued working with the Town Centre Partnership on ways to promote Buckhurst Hill's Town Centres. One such way is in the development of a Business Directory for Queens Road and we will be starting work on this shortly. Once completed we hope that it will form part of a document that would be distributed across Buckhurst Hill this summer. The Parish Council will also be exploring ways of encouraging local residents to shop locally and support their local business; not just those in Queens Road but the other local retail areas also.

The Council also supported local businesses in directing residents to Queens Road on the day of the Tour de France last year and we hope to build on this success in support of other community based events going forward. For the event the Parish Council also purchased 20 planters and placed them along Queens Road. This was well received and certainly brightened up the road. These planters where replanted with seasonal plants for the winter months and we are in the process of organising new plants for the spring and summer months.

The Community Cinema for young families at the Roding Valley Hall continues to be highly successful,

to the extent that at the end of April (24th) we had our first evening showing – The Grand Budapest Hotel. This was especially very well attended and as a consequence we are already planning another evening film show later this summer.

The Parish Council continue to work very closely with the BH Leisure Gardens Association and also funded security improvements at the Council's allotment sites.

One of the frustrations that I personally felt was that we have not yet been able to book a date for this year's Older People's Forum event. However, I know that the Clerk is working hard behind the scenes and I am confident that the Forum also will take place later this summer. As a direct result of the Forum held last year, Buckhurst Hill now has a U3A with over 100 members.

In December last year I also attended the lighting of the Menorah in Queens Road for the beginning of Chanukah. It reminded me about the diversity of our local community and the many ways in which we come together to celebrate festivals and significant events.

One of the most significant event of the past year was without doubt the commemoration of the outbreak of the First World War. The Council joined with the Royal British Legion to put a new plaque on the War Memorial at St John's Church. The plaque bears the names of Buckhurst Hill boys who gave their lives in the war but had not been remembered locally until now. In July 2016 the Royal British Legion will hold events to commemorate the Battle of the Somme and, as part of those commemorations, they will be hosting a Veterans Association from France. The Parish Council will play both an active and supportive role in those commemorations.

I hope that in 2015/16 the Council will lead the development of a local Dementia Action Alliance as a first step towards making Buckhurst Hill a better place to live for people with Dementia. On the evening of the Parish Assembly (May 14th) a "Dementia Awareness" training session was held in Waitrose for traders, as an initial step in that development process. Later the same evening, at the Parish Assembly, a cheque for £1001, raised jointly by the Parish Council and Residents Society over the last year was presented to Megan Bailey of the Alzheimer's Society, which is my Chairman's Charity for this year.

Finally, I would like to thank my fellow Councillors for their valued contributions over the course of the last year and I would also like to say a particular "Thank You" to my Vice-Chair (Cllr Hale Wheeler) for her valued support and sound judgement.

Finance & Establishment Committee

t has been a privilege to serve in the role of Chairman of the Finance and Establishment Committee of Buckhurst Parish Council for the 2014/15 municipal year. I am pleased to report that the financial position of the parish council is sound. The financial benefits of moving to the library are now being seen with a reduction in our annual establishment operating expenditure of about £50,000. This has enabled the parish council to include the costs of a PCSO and the first phase of preparing a neighbourhood plan for Buckhurst Hill in our budget for 2015/16.

Our two halls, the Woollard Centre and the Roding Valley Hall, have achieved good income figures also after a marketing exercise. However, whilst the income covers the day to day running costs the more major repairs and improvements needed to bring them up to modern day standards remain a challenge and the provision of hall facilities will require the sort of innovative solution that this parish council has shown itself to be adept at finding.

Another benefit of the move to the library was the capital surplus of about £95,000 on the sale of the old offices. This capital reserve is now available to the parish council to contribute towards the funding of future capital projects. I am confident that this money will be used to maximum effect by a parish council that has demonstrated its ability to provide better and more cost effective services to residents.

I am particularly happy to be able to report that we have achieved this while freezing the bills to residents despite a reduction in the support grant from central government. Further, that our general reserves remain in excess of the recommended minimum. Finally, I am pleased to report that the parish council's accounts received a clean audit report.

Finally it only remains for me to thank my fellow members of the Finance and Establishment Committee, the vice chairman Cllr Neil Cohen, Cllr Lucy Bacon, Cllr Jo Share-Bernia, Cllr Hale Wheeler, Cllr Aniket Patel and Cllr Neville Wright for all their support and the Deputy Clerk Mrs Val Evans for all her work in maintaining our accounting systems and preparing the financial reports.

Recreation & Community Committee

t has been yet another busy year for the Recreation and Community Committee. I am pleased to report that we have had a further two Community Cinema events. We had a screening of the Lion King last year and we recently showed Lego Movie and The Grand Budapest Hotel in one day. The latter film marked our first evening cinema event, which saw a really great turn out.

The Recreation and Community Committee has a lot of involvement in the Parish Council's Christmas activities. This year, as always, it provided the budget for the Parish Council's Christmas lights and motifs on Queen's Road. Yet again these supplied a perfect backdrop for the Queen's Road Christmas Fair, detailed in the Chairman's Report.

The tradition of giving to the most needy, elderly people in Buckhurst Hill was carried on this year and Parish Councillors hand delivered gifts to these residents before Christmas. The Christmas card competition involving children from local schools was also organised by this Committee and the

winners were chosen by a panel of Councillors including District and Parish Councillor, Sylvia Watson.

Through this Committee, the Parish Council has also continued to work with Buckhurst Hill Leisure Gardens Association ('BHLGA') on maintaining the Parish Council's allotments and improving their security for the people who use them.

With the budget provided by this Committee, the Parish Council has continued to maintain the land which it owns or for which it has some degree of responsibility. In addition to significant tree work already carried out, further assessment and work on trees is expected for the future.

The Parish Council also maintains those bus shelters and benches, which it owns. Through the Recreation and Community Committee, the Parish Council appears to be close to resolving the problem of a missing bus shelter on the High Road, Buckhurst Hill.

This Committee has also continued to provide a budget for maintenance of the

Parish Council's playgrounds at King's Place and the playground and ball court facilities at the Roding Valley Recreation Ground.

In pursuit of improving the recreational facilities available to the people of Buckhurst Hill, this Committee has obtained the go ahead for an outdoor gym on the disused land at Hornbeam Road. A budget of £25,000 has been set aside and the Parish Council were also successful in obtaining grant funding. A tender process for the construction of the outdoor gym is currently under way and we look forward to the gym being opened in the foreseeable future.

Other events with which this Committee has been to some extent involved, include the Parish Council's support of the Tour de France events in Buckhurst Hill and contribution towards a World War memorial plaque. These matters are dealt with in more detail in the Chairman's Report.

Planning & Environment Committee

he Council's planning committee meets fortnightly and has held twenty four meetings over the last year.

The Council is a statutory consultee for planning applications and its views are taken into account by the planning authority, Epping Forest District Council.

The Committee has considered a large number of applications over the year. The two among these that stand out were the proposed redevelopment of the site at St Elizabeth's Church, Chestnut Avenue and the proposed development on 1 Powell Road. The latter in particular arousing significant local opposition with a large number of residents attended several planning meetings to put their concerns to the Committee. The Committee opposed both applications and the current plans for 1 Powell Road have subsequently been withdrawn.

The Committee has also closely monitored the development of Epping Forest District Council's Local Plan.

Planning is a difficult and sensitive area, involving as it often does trying to balance the interests of one group against the interests of another. I am grateful to all of the members of the Planning Committee for their support throughout the year, particularly when there have been complex or contentious applications to consider. Special thanks must also be given to the Vice Chair, Councillor Taylor for chairing meetings in my absence and Deputy Clerk Val Evans for voicing our reasons for objection so eloquently when writing the minutes of meetings.

We look forward to working with the new clerk, Kevin O'Brien and new Parish Councillors Smruti Patel and Ryan Sparrowhawk in the forthcoming year.

ead of the Central Line Chris Taggart has now confirmed the following work is to be done.

Local Plan Update

he Local Councils' Liaison meeting on 15 June 2015

brought together town and parish councillors from around the district to hear about the first stage of the Green Belt Review and Settlement Hierarchy. This will form a key part of the evidence base for the district's Local Plan that will determine the amount and location of land allocated for future development.

Buckhurst Hill Parish Council was represented by the Chairman, Cllr Aniket Patel, one of our newest parish councillors Cllr Smruti Patel, Cllr Sylvia Watson and the Deputy Parish Clerk, Mrs Val Evans.

The start of the meeting was overshadowed by the disquiet voiced by the town and parish councillors about the meeting not being webcast and the deadline for comments being a mere two weeks. I am pleased to report that the deadline was later extended to 27 July 2015.

Concern was also expressed about the proposal to undertake the public consultation about the Preferred Options during the summer months when many residents are away on holiday.

The presentation by officers of their draft Green Belt Review (Stage 1) covered their appraisal of areas of green belt areas against its four purposes as set out in the National Planning Policy Framework:

- To check the unrestricted sprawl of large built-up areas
- To prevent neighbouring towns merging into one another
- To assist in safeguarding the countryside from encroachment
- To preserve the setting and special character of historic towns

Based on this they identified broad locations for further assessment. They recognise that there is little land remaining outside of the areas covered by absolute constraints. However they go on to say that given the continuous built nature of Buckhurst Hill and Loughton/Debden, all land in the Green belt within the defined buffer has been included for further assessment.

The defined buffer is 2km from the settlement centre boundary, Central Line station and bus stops within the existing settlement boundary. This is the maximum buffer and it is only applied to those settlements classed as towns

Buckhurst Hill has been designated as a town in the draft settlement hierarchy that scores criteria such as the presence of a school. Some of the criteria attributed to Buckhurst Hill appear to be incorrect and this is just one matter that the parish council will examine closely and comment on.

Buckhurst Hill Parish Council will consider its response to the draft Green Belt Review (Stage 1) at its meeting on Thursday 23 July 2015. BHCA at Bedford House

o many, the words Community Association will evoke a hall for sport and functions, a bar, and meeting rooms for local groups. 
