Annual Parish Assembly

A joint recruitment process involving Buckhurst Hill Parish Council and Essex Police is to take place to bring a Special Constable to Buckhurst Hill.

News of the initative – which follows failed attempts by the parish council to get a dedicated Police Community Support Officer for the parish – was reported at the council's Annual Parish Assembly.

Vice-chairman councillor Bobby Nagpal, giving the chairman's report in the absence of chairman councillor Neville Wright - said the appointed Special Constable would patrol the area on a regular basis and establish links with schools and local organisations.

The chairman's report also highlighted the council's response to Epping Forest District Council's Draft Local Plan to which the parish

council had given a "vigorous response" regarding the three sites in the parish considered suitable for housing. The parish

council had responded to the public consultation

by detailing "significant problems" with each of the locations.

The parish council's Community Cinema screenings and the library volunteers scheme have been a great success.

Three Waitrose staff are among the volunteers who provide a friendly and helpful service for library visitors.

Anyone interested in becoming a library volunteer should contact the parish council.

Fundraising by the parish council during the past year raised £1,074 for Carers UK.

Dee Brecker, the charity's director of communications and fundraising, spoke about the history and work of the organisation, which was founded

in 1965 "by carers, for carers"!, before receiving a cheque from the council. She said: "Thank you massively for your contribution. We simply couldn't do what we do without you."

Thursday's Annual Parish Assembly also heard reports from local organisations -Buckhurst Hill Community Association, the Buckhurst Hill branch of the Royal British Legion and Buckhurst Hill Residents' Society.

From the Chairman

The months following our last Parish Magazine certainly have been eventful on the National Stage with the outcomes of County and General Elections but more poignantly in terms of terrorist attacks and the tragedy of the Grenfell House fire. Consequently, I feel that it is fully appropriate to add our voices of sympathy to those who have lost family and friends in Manchester and in more recent events here in London.

Notwithstanding, we continue to make progress on a number of initiatives that I hope will make more positive reading in our autumn edition.

Our main disappointment is that we are still needing more volunteers to come forward to enable us to get our own SpeedWatch scheme up and running here in Buckhurst Hill. Currently we have not reached the minimum number of volunteers required by Essex Fire & Rescue (who are now responsible for SpeedWatch in Essex) for a scheme to be set up and training to be given. It does seem somewhat strange that one of the regular issues that residents draw to our attention is that of speeding cars, yet our recent appeal for volunteers to help set up a local scheme has been met with a somewhat underwhelming response to date. Work is also currently under way on our new Parish Council website. We feel that when it is up and running later this summer/early autumn, that residents will find it visually more appealing and the links and content much more informative.

We are still working on aspects of our Neighbourhood Plan. We have recently had positive discussions with the District Council regarding progress to date and we have also met with the Rural Community Council for Essex (RCCE) who have agreed to assist us on a couple of the specialist areas of the Neighbourhood Plan's development.

We have also made significant progress with Essex Police regarding acquiring our own Special Constable and we believe that the recruitment campaign will begin in a few months' time.

I would also like to promote the "Play in the Park" scheme that will be operating in the Roding Valley Recreation Ground during the school summer holidays (see poster on page 11). This is a joint venture with EFDC.

Work is also progressing well on preparations for the Older Persons Winter Warmers Event set for November and the "Christmas on Queens Road" event on December 1st. In addition a charity event in aid of "Marie Curie" is in the planning stage and will be held at the Roding Valley Hall during October this year. Details will be made available via our usual media outlets in the near future.

I am delighted to welcome a new member of staff (Liane Davies) to our Parish Office team. Liane will work closely with the Clerk on key projects.

Finally, may I wish you all a really pleasurable summer.

It does not seem possible that I am already at the end of my first year. I have thoroughly enjoyed being one of your Parish Councillors. Last year I joined the Finance, Recreation & Community, Planning, Accommodation and Personnel committees to gain as much experience as possible and this year I will continue with these same committees. The majority of my year was being involved with Planning meetings, Christmas on Queens Road and some of the parking issues we face. As chair of the Buckhurst Hill Village Forum and a business owner on Queens Road, I am also very interested in all the local business areas.

I have particularly been impressed by how well run the Parish Office is and what a great team we have in all our councillors. We are very lucky in Buckhurst Hill to have such a variety of skills and expertise amongst our Parish Councillors. Having great support from both the District and County councillors also makes our roles easier. We all have a common goal to improve living and working in Buckhurst Hill and we are always delighted to hear from any residents who would like to discuss any local issues.



News from County Cllr Valerie Metcalfe

First, I want to thank those residents who supported me in the county elections in May, and together with your district and parish councillors, I will continue to ensure that the interests of everyone in Buckhurst Hill remain high on the agenda.

As I write, the sun is shining and the skies are blue – and I am sure we are all looking forward to a good summer. The trees and flowers are out and everywhere looks glorious, including so many radiant gardens in our residential roads - but Highways problems are always with us. We still have the difficulty of persuading Essex Highways to repair some of our potholes, including the disgraceful ones in Queens Road, and the resurfacing of some of our roads which were promised earlier this year, such as Hawsted which is more pothole than road. I continue to pursue these issues relentlessly and feel nearly as frustrated as many residents must.

The demand for more residents parking zones continues and we need to find a simpler and quicker way to get these in place. At the moment, all these schemes are sent up to the North Essex Parking Partnership, working from Colchester, and they are overwhelmed with similar schemes across the region that they do not have the resources and capacity to keep up with demand. I still say we need to find another way to fund them

and persuade NEPP to let our own Epping Forest District Council deliver local schemes. In the meantime, please contact me if you have any particular county issues that I can help with – and I look forward to catching up with many of you in the coming weeks and months.


