Neighbourhood

Firstly thank you to all of those who replied to our first survey last autumn. The replies we received form the basis of a second questionnaire which you will soon receive. What we would like to do now is to gather a bit more detailed

information on the key points that came through last time. In turn this will help to inform our initial draft plan document, which we will look to start preparing after Christmas. We would hope that you will complete the questionnaire and return to us as soon as possible. A version of the questionnaire will be available on our website also, if you would prefer that format. The final date for returning questionnaires will be January 12th, 2018.

From the last questionnaire, the seven most quoted issues under the heading of "What don't you like about Buckhurst Hill?" were (in no particular order).

Parking Issues. The questionnaire section on Parking looks to delve further into this issue.

Speeding Cars/Traffic Congestion. The Parish Council are currently in discussions with various agencies regarding traffic calming measures in Loughton Way and the questionnaire section on Speeding and Traffic Congestion looks further into this issue.

Lack of Police Presence. The Parish Council have a strategy in place to address this issue and more information for residents should be available in the near future.

Accelerating Urbanisation/Property Development. The questionnaire section on Housing and Development looks further into this issue. Other issues within this heading are looked at in the questionnaire section on Open Spaces and Leisure.

Poor Maintenance of Roads and Pavements. This is generally outside the powers delegated to the Parish Council but we are always pressing for improvements through both Epping Forest District Council and Essex County Council – Highways.

Lack of variety of shops in Queens Road. Although outside the remit of the Parish Council we are actively working with all shop owners and prospective owners to broaden the variety of shops available.

Oversubscribed Schools. We are discussing this with Epping Forest District Council in relation to the additional development that may be forced on us through the Local Plan. We are also looking at possible over subscription at GP Surgeries and Dentist's Clinics.



We would urge you

to complete the questionnaire and thereby enable us to develop a Neighbourhood Plan that will help to shape Buckhurst Hill in the future.

We will soon be embarking on a fresh round of consultations in connection with our Neighbourhood Plan. The first element of which is a fresh, more targeted questionnaire. You will find much more information on this elsewhere in the magazine but I would like to encourage you to respond to the questionnaire and ask you to get your neighbours to do so also. Your responses will help us to influence what Buckhurst Hill will look and feel like in years to come.

Currently, the Parish Office Team are preparing for events that will take place throughout December and the festive period. Our biggest event being the annual "Christmas in Queens Road" event on December 1st. Although it is very hard work for all of us getting everything in place for the day, it is well worthwhile because of the enjoyment the activities generate. So please make a date in your diary and come along between 3pm and 7pm. All the proceeds collected on the day go to the Chairman's charity, Carers UK.

I regret to say that we are still operating from our temporary accommodation and at the time of writing a return to the Library could be some months off yet. Notwithstanding, the volunteers continue to oversee the "Self-Service" provision on Mondays and Wednesdays and a member of the Parish Office Staff is also available on these days.

Finally, may I offer you the very best of wishes for the Festive Season from all of us here in the Parish Office.

At district we have been dealing with the Local Plan: two more sites have been added to the list in Buckhurst Hill to be assessed and may be added to the three sites that were allocated in the draft Local Plan. One of them is Victoria House in Victoria Road and the other is a plot of land at the bottom of Lower Queens Road, which was part of a bigger site rejected before. In all the meetings I go to I press the need for there to be infrastructure to meet current and future need. I say no to any development without this being in some way secured. EFDC are basing their infrastructure plans on contributions from the developers but it is clear the developers find ways of not paying as much as they should do and can't be guaranteed to deliver the sort of infrastructure we really need. Essex have made clear that any increase in housing in Buckhurst Hill will not see an improvement in our bus services and there will only be a small improvement to services in areas of much bigger developments not in Buckhurst Hill. EFDC say they want a step change

in our mode of transport by moving us away from using the car onto using walking, cycling and public transport but without commitment from Essex to vastly improve public transport, working with TfL, then that is an empty promise that will not be delivered. The Local Plan is having its timetable stepped up after the announcement by the Department of Communities and Local Government that Epping Forest is to include 4000 extra affordable homes into its Local Plan and this would see an extra 9000 dwellings in the plan (which would see an overall increase in the number of homes in Epping Forest by 20,000 instead of 11,000 in the period 2011 – 2033). We have been told the only way to get out of this is to have our Local Plan in by March 2018. The plans are already unpopular and giving us this ultimatum seems like a slap in the face.

Fly Tipping is on the increase. I have had to report and follow up on several cases. Essex are refusing to take the blame for any of the increase but wait and see is all I can say.

I regularly have meetings with the Police, and have pressed the need for action to do with the selling of drugs in Blackmore Road and the Chestnut Avenue/Hornbeam Road area and am glad to report that 6 arrests have been made. I have also made the police aware of similar activity in Lower Queens Road.

Residents,

I want to hear from you about your concerns in Buckhurst Hill. Many of you have emailed me about the approaching Local Plan. This is the most important issue facing us in Buckhurst Hill at the moment on the District Council.

I continue to hold quarterly surgery and many of you are also excited about the possibility of the upcoming protection of St. John's area as a conservation area.

I have been working on this

Conservation project for some time and remain-hopeful that in early 2018 we will have a final decision. Nothing happens over night as consultation and heritage reports take some time.

I am still the Chairman of Plan South for another year and I am very pleased to report that many inappropriate developments have been turned down at district level. I am also pleased to see the hard work that Cllr Ken Williamson is doing on chairing planning on the Parish Council.

The most recent application at time of writing this article was the proposed new design of Braeside School which would have seen a real increase in pupils but a real increase in traffic issues for the residents of Westbury Lane.

We also need to be careful when driving this winter. Accidents on the roads involving deer increase during this time of year in the district and motorists should take extra care when driving through the forest and rural parts of the district.

The rutting season has begun and goes on until late November. Deer are particularly active at dawn and dusk. Unfortunately this coincides with commuting hours which are often the busiest times of the day on our roads.

You only need to take a stroll in the early morning through Lords Bushes and Knighton Wood to see the increase in deer this year.

If you happened to be calling in to St. James URC at the top of Palmerston Road recently you may have noticed the giant pumpkins standing sentry outside their entrance door. These were donated by an allotment grower from the Lower Queens Rd site and heralded the Barn Dance and Harvest Festival which took place over the weekend 23/24th September there.

The vision of the church members was to think about Harvest in a new way- not just gathering in the gluts of fruit and vegetables to decorate the church, but to share that abundant harvest, not only amongst ourselves but with those locally who are struggling to make ends meet week by week. So members of St. James set about growing fruit and vegetables back in the Spring, sharing their seedlings and growing tips amongst each other. The Guides, Brownies, Beavers, Cubs and Scouts who hold their meetings at St. James also started growing vegetables all in preparation for the Harvest weekend.

Finally the weekend arrived and a Barn Dance was held on the Saturday night. A traditional live barn dance band led by caller Jane Pfaff and her musicians from the "Let's Dance Band" immediately got everyone's feet tapping and from 2 years to 82, the dancers joined in with enthusiasm. During the interval while the dancers enjoyed locally grown and cooked harvest food, Heather Scholer, manager of Epping Forest Foodbank outlined the need in our area for the Foodbank. Rev. Richard Mortimer, one of the ministers of the Forest Group of URC's presented Heather with a cheque for the Foodbank as a result of the evening's success. Further dancing followed until everyone was exhausted!

Then on the Sunday the church filled with families of the Scouts, Guides, Cubs, Brownies and Beavers while Rev. Ulrike Bell led a service full of music and praise for the Harvest. Gifts of food parcels were donated by everyone and were taken to the Loughton Foodbank to distribute to people there in need.

"This has been a year in the planning, one of sowing, cultivating and finally reaping", said Margaret Minoletti, Elder at St. James and the main organiser of the event. "After all the doubt and uncertainty in growing anything, it is such a joy to see the fruits of all the work- the smiles on people's faces as they danced, the joy of being together and then the chance to share so much with Epping Forest's Foodbank made this a very memorable and meaningful Harvest indeed".

St. James plan to organise more seasonal events- look out for Maypole dancing in the Spring!





- 4. Be visible and accessible in local communities on uniformed, foot or cycle patrol.
- 5. Help address local issues and priorities as informed by the local council and police intelligence-led tasking.
- 6. Patrol hot spots identified through intelligence or which have been deemed to be priority areas.
- 7. Respond to police-related incidents within the council area.
- 8. Engage with local communities and support further recruitment of Specials.
- 9. Attend suitable local council meetings where available to do so.
- 10. Have regard to the Council's aims and objectives in their voluntary service.
